

Donation Guidelines for The Future Party (TFP)

Thank you for considering a donation to The Future Party (TFP). Your support is crucial in helping us build a better future for all Kenyans through transparency, equity, and inclusivity. Below, we outline the terms and conditions for donations as guided by the **Political Parties Act** in Kenya. By making a donation, you agree to comply with these guidelines.

1. Eligibility to Donate

- Donations can be made by **individuals, organizations, or entities** who meet the criteria set forth in the Political Parties Act.
- Donations from **foreign governments, state-owned enterprises, or anonymous sources** are strictly prohibited.
- Donors must provide accurate and verifiable information, including their full name, contact details, and identification documents (for individuals) or registration details (for organizations).

2. Acceptable Donations

- Donations can be made in the form of **cash, checks, electronic transfers, or other legally recognized means**.
- In-kind donations, such as goods or services, must be declared and valued at their fair market price.
- All donations must be **voluntary** and without any expectation of favor or influence over the party's policies or decisions.

3. Donation Limits

- In compliance with the Political Parties Act, the **maximum limit for donations from a single source within a financial year is KES 20 million**.
- Any donation exceeding this limit will be returned to the donor or handled in accordance with the law.

4. Declaration and Transparency

- TFP is committed to transparency and accountability. All donations will be recorded and declared in accordance with the Political Parties Act.
- Donations exceeding **KES 1 million** from a single source will be reported to the **Registrar of Political Parties** and published in TFP's annual financial reports.



- Donors acknowledge that their details may be disclosed as required by law, except for personal information protected under data privacy regulations.

5. Prohibited Donations

- TFP will not accept donations from:
 - Unregistered entities or individuals.
 - Foreign governments, agencies, or state-owned enterprises.
 - Anonymous or pseudonymous sources.
 - Entities or individuals involved in illegal activities.
- Any prohibited donation received will be returned to the donor or surrendered to the Registrar of Political Parties.

6. Use of Donations

- Donations will be used exclusively to support TFP's activities, including policy development, campaigns, capacity building, and community empowerment initiatives.
- Funds will be managed responsibly and in compliance with the Political Parties Act and other relevant laws.

7. Refund Policy

- Donations are non-refundable except in cases where the donation exceeds legal limits, is prohibited, or is made in error. In such cases, TFP will work with the donor to resolve the issue promptly.
